

Care & Best Practices



In order to keep your countertops looking as good as the day they were installed, be sure to follow these best practices:

Do:

- Clean the surface with a damp rag or sponge and use mild soap or detergent. Rinse thoroughly and wipe dry
- For stubborn stains like coffee or tea, clean with a mild cleaner and a soft bristled brush, repeating as necessary
- If a stain persists, use a paste of baking soda and water and apply with a soft bristled brush. Light scrubbing for 10 to 20 strokes should remove most stains. Although baking soda is a low abrasive, excessive scrubbing or exerting too much force could damage the decorative surface, especially if it has a gloss finish
- Dry Microfiber cloths can be used to keep dust at bay

Don't:

- Sharp objects that could scratch the surface
- Acidic or abrasive cleaners
- Drain cleaners containing lye
- Hair, textile and food dyes
- Hot Pots or plates
- Oven cleaners
- Rust removers
- Steel wool and other abrasive pads
- Toilet bowl cleaners
